

On-Campus Services

In addition to the benefits outlined on the accompanying pages, Birmingham-Southern offers the following services for you:

Athletic Events – You can attend regular season athletic events on campus for free. You also can receive discounted memberships to team booster clubs. Summer camp fees are discounted.

Banking – An ATM provided by Regions is located on the second floor of the Norton Campus Center for your convenience. Student Services can cash your personal checks up to \$100.

Bookstore – Located on the first floor of the Norton Campus Center, the Bookstore offers text books, trade books, and school and office supplies. Also available are cards, balloons, BSC apparel, and a wide selection of gift items for every occasion. Free gift wrap is available with purchase.

Campus Dining – “The Court” is located on the first floor of the Norton Campus Center and offers a variety of dining choices for you. These choices include pasta and salad bars, traditional Southern foods, international foods, grilled items, pizza, sandwiches, and smoothies. Forms of payment accepted include cash, check, VISA, MasterCard, and campus ID cards.

Chapel – You can choose from services in the Methodist, Baptist, Catholic, and Episcopal ministries held each week. Contact extension 4760 for a service schedule.

Charles Andrew Rush Learning Center/N. E. Miles Library – You and your family members may utilize the library’s collection of resources including: books, periodicals, newspapers, DVD’s, films, audio cassettes, and compact discs. Interlibrary loan service is also available.

Credit Union – First Educator’s Credit Union membership offers you the opportunity to payroll deduct for savings, loan payments, Christmas Club, IRAs, and more.

Fine and Performing Arts

Conservatory of Fine & Performing Arts – Offers non-credit musical instruction for your children, beginning at age 18 months through adult. Private instruction, as well as class instruction is available. Summer camps, including a music camp and theatre arts camp, are discounted. Contact extension 4960 for additional information.

Dance – Summer dance camps are offered for children age 12 through adult. Contact extension 4945 for additional information.

Fine Arts Events – Theatrical presentations, art exhibits, and concerts are held regularly. You can attend these events either free-of-charge or at a reduced admission.

Fine Arts Society – Provides support to the Fine and Performing Arts on campus. You can join at a discounted rate. Contact extension 4922 for additional information.

Fitness and Recreation – You and your family may utilize the services of the Striplin Fitness and Recreation Center. The Center houses basketball, volleyball, and racquetball courts, an indoor swimming pool, fitness and weight machines, pool and ping pong tables, and an indoor walking track. Fitness classes are also offered. Contact extension 4937 for scheduled classes.

I.D. Cards – You should have an I.D. card made at the Student Services Building. This card includes your campus identification number, which you will need to access your College email account. It also entitles you to free or reduced charges at campus events, provides library privileges, and access to the Striplin Recreation Center. The I.D. may also be used as a debit card in the campus eating facilities, bookstore, and copy machines.

Meyer Planetarium/Southern Environmental Center/Ecoscape – You and your family may view a planetarium presentation, tour the Southern Environmental Center’s interactive museum, and visit the Ecoscape gardens free-of-charge.

Monday Morning – You will receive an electronic campus newsletter each Monday morning. Submission deadline for the Monday Morning is Thursday noon. Please contact extension 4921 for additional information.

Parking – There is no charge for parking. You may obtain an automobile decal for your vehicle at the Student Services Building. Decals should be displayed on the lower section of the front windshield, driver’s side. You are encouraged to park in green parking zones. Student parking zones are designated as white. Reserved parking is designated as red.

Personal Counseling and Health Services – Located on the second floor of the Norton Campus Center. Personal counselors, a registered nurse, and a physician are available to serve you. Health services include allergy injections, blood pressure screenings, nutrition and diet counseling, and management of minor illnesses and injuries. Please contact extension 4717 to schedule an appointment. There is no charge for these services, excluding physician services which can be filed on your BlueCross or VIVA health insurance.

Post Office – Located on the first floor of the Norton Campus Center, the Post Office offers all services typical of a branch postal office. The campus zip code is 35254.

Safety and Security – Campus Police officers provide security 24 hours per day. Blue light phones are strategically located at six different locations on campus, plus at the entrance of each residence hall. These phones may be used for assistance at any time. Campus Police are available to escort you to your vehicle and to assist with car problems. Contact extension 4700 for Campus Police.

Service Awards – The President hosts an annual Faculty-Staff Appreciation Dinner to honor employees who have reached a milestone anniversary in their service to the College.

Technology Training – The Human Resources Office provides coupons for technology training at the beginning, intermediate, and advanced levels. Coupons may be used for a variety of courses including Word, Excel, Access, and PowerPoint. Training is provided off campus by New Horizons. The College HelpDesk, extension 4849, is available to assist you with software questions.
