SUMMER TIMELINE

COMPLETE THE HOUSING APP

Must be completed by June 15! Check your BSC email for instructions.

ROOM ASSIGNMENTS SENT

Room and Roommate assignments sent out via BSC email by the end of July

CHECK BSC EMAIL

Detailed move-in information and directions will be sent in early August

ROOM ASSIGNMENTS

HOUSING APPLICATION

Housing agreement, personal and living preferences, emergency contact information

RESIDENCE LIFE MATCHING

ATHLETES


Athletes can live with a teammate, another athlete, or a non-athlete; decide what is best for you, not what coach wants!

LIVE-ON REQUIREMENT

Birmingham-Southern believes in the transformative power of the residential experience. Because of this, students are required to live on campus unless they have achieved senior-class status (23 units) before the beginning of the fall term. Students who are 21 years old by the start date of fall term, are married, or live with their parent(s) or legal guardian(s) within 10-miles of campus may reside off campus.

NEW MEN'S HALL

All first-year male students live in double occupancy rooms with a community bathroom in the middle of each floor.

CULLEN DANIEL/MARGARET DANIEL HALLS

All first-year female students live in double occupancy rooms with two community bathrooms on each floor

TRANSFER STUDENTS

Transfer students can live in any upperclass residential building with availability; ResLife will contact you regarding options.

GETTING YOUR ASSIGNMENT

WHAT'S INCLUDED

Building and Room Number, Roommate Name, Roommate Contact Information

BILLING

First-year housing is billed before each term and is \$4,100/term

MAKE A PLAN

Make sure your student contacts their roommate early!

LIVING WITH A ROOMMATE

TALK EARLY, TALK OFTEN

Reach out and start talking now! Don't wait until August 19!



COORDINATE BIG ITEMS

AUGUST 19, 2022 TIMELINE

CHECK-IN BEGINS AT 8:00AM

Check your email for specific instructions on arriving to campus, parking, and checking in.

GET SET UP

Once you are checked in, you will follow the directions of Campus Police to unload and head to your student's room.

SAYING SO LONG!

After lunch, join us on the Residence Hall Quad for a sweet treat and to say so long to your students.

MOVE-IN DAY TIPS

LABEL EVERYTHING

Put your <u>student's name and room number</u> on <u>every</u> box, bag, etc. that goes in the car. This is a great job for siblings to get them involved and excited.

DON'T OVERPACK

They don't need everything they own - remember they can go back and get stuff from home during breaks.

WE HAVE STORES IN BIRMINGHAM

Target, Wal-Mart, and Home Depot are all very close. Don't panic if you forget things at home.

EARLY ARRIVAL INFORMATION

SPECIFIC GROUPS ONLY

Early arrival is limited to specific athletic teams and organizations pre-approved to move in prior to August 19.

DETAILS IN BSC EMAIL

Specific move-in time and information will be sent via Residence Life and Athletics in early August.

SEND FOR HELP

Unfortunately, move-in assistance is not provided during early arrival days. Please be sure to have family/friends to help your student move in.

WHAT TO LEAVE AT HOME

- TOASTERS, TOASTER OVENS, OR ANYTHING WITH AN EXPOSED HEATING ELEMENT THAT GETS HOT
 - AIR FRYERS, INSTA-POTS
 - SPACE HEATERS
 - CANDLES, INCENSE, OR ANYTHING WITH A FLAME
 - WEAPONS, FIREWORKS, ETC.
 - MUSIC AMPLIFIERS, SURROUND SOUND, ETC.
 - WIRELESS ROUTERS
 - PETS (OTHER THAN A FISH IN A SMALL TANK) "NO PETS NAMED FISH"

WHAT'S IN THE ROOM?

BED AND TWIN XL MATTRESS

Beds are adjustable in height for added storage; bed risers are okay if manufactured for that purpose.

Coin-free washers and dryers in the basement of each building

Supporting your student during this transition can be tough, but we are here to partner with you to provide the best experience possible.

LIVING WITH OTHERS

ENCOURAGE THEM TO TALK TO THEIR ROOMMATE

Talk directly with their roommate - before anyone else (or social media). We want them to feel comfortable living in their room and talking things out can often nip problems in the bud.

DON'T LET THE SMALL THINGS BUILD UP

Encourage constant communication among roommates. Waiting may make it worse and it could cause a snowball effect.

TRUST THEM AND TRUST US

Allow them to handle the situation and encourage them to reach out to ResLife for assistance if they need it. Doing it for them won't help and often makes it worse.



Encourage them to get involved with a student organization, but also find a balance so they don't overextend themselves.
