

- Episcopal Group—weekly Eucharist, pasta nights, studies
- UKIRK (PCUSA)—weekly student gathering, off-campus events
- Wesley Fellowship (UMC)—weekly study and dinner
- Reformed University Fellowship (PCA)—weekly worship, small groups
- Baptist Campus Ministries—weekly Bible study, off-campus events
- Muslim Student Association—meeting and event times vary (Dr. Shoreibah)
- Hillel (Jewish student group)—meeting and event times vary (Dr. Seigel)
